This internal reprogramming action transfers \$2.477 million from Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Navy (RDT&EN), 01/02, to Operation and Maintenance, Navy (OMN), FY 2001. This action uses general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 106-259, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2001, and section 1001 of Public Law 106-398, the Floyd D. Spence National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2001. Reclassification is required to properly execute funds in accordance with congressional intent. This realignment does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated, meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress.



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Explanation: The Smart Base project, established by the 1997 Defense Authorization Act, promotes innovative solutions that apply proven, state-of-the-art, technologies and business practices that will increase infrastructure efficiency, maintain readiness and reduce the cost of the infrastructure. During FY 1997 through FY 1999, specific initiatives were selected, analyzed and implemented. As solutions moved from the developmental phase to implementation and Navy-wide deployment, the Department of Navy budgeted OMN funds to the Smart Base project for these operational expenses.

In FY 2001, the Congress added \$2.5 million for Smart Base initiatives to the RDT&EN appropriation. However, these additional funds, needed to complete on-going initiatives at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, are for operational, vice developmental, expenses, and are more appropriately financed in OMN. The transferred amount reflects a reduction of \$18,000, associated with P.L. 106-259, section 8086 and \$5,000 associated with P.L. 106-554, the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2001.
