

1 (d) EXCEPTIONS.—(1) This section shall not apply in
2 the event of a declaration of war or an armed attack on
3 Japan.

4 (2) This section may be waived by the President if he
5 declares an emergency and immediately informs the Congress
6 of the waiver and the reasons for the waiver.

7 (e) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall take effect
8 on the date of enactment of this Act.

9 (350) SEC. 8006. Notwithstanding any other provision
10 of this Act, the Operations and Maintenance accounts and
11 revolving and management funds shall be reduced by
12 \$400,000,000 to reduce inapplicable inventories.

13 (351) TRANSPORTATION OF CHEMICAL WEAPONS

14 SEC. 8077. (a) None of the funds appropriated or other-
15 wise made available in this Act may be used to transport or
16 provide for the transportation of chemical munitions to the
17 Johnston Atoll for the purpose of storing or demilitarizing
18 such munitions.

19 (b) The prohibition in subsection (a) shall not apply to:

20 (1) any chemical munition withdrawn from the
21 Federal Republic of Germany under a European ret-
22 rograde program; or

23 (2) any obsolete World War II chemical muni-
24 tion of the United States found in the World War II
25 Pacific Theater of Operations.

1 (c) The provisions of subsection (b)(1) shall not be
2 strued to supersede or otherwise affect the decision of
3 court relating to the authority of the President or Secre-
4 of Defense under any other law to transport chemical m-
5 tions to Johnston Atoll for demilitarization or to store on
6 Johnston Atoll for the demilitarization or storage of chen-
7 nitions withdrawn from the Federal Republic of Germ-
8 under a European retrograde program.

9 (d) The President may suspend the application of
10 section (a) during a period of war in which the United S
11 is a party.

12 (352) CORPORATE INFORMATION MANAGEMENT

13 INITIATIVE (TRANSFER OF FUNDS)

14 SEC. 8078. In addition to the amounts appropriat-
15 otherwise made available in this Act, \$1,000,000,000 is
16 appropriated for the modernization and expansion of autom-
17 data processing systems: Provided, That the Secretary of
18 fense shall, upon determining that such funds are neces-
19 and further the objectives of the Corporate Information M-
20 agement Initiative, transfer such amounts as necessary to
21 appropriate operation and maintenance appropriations
22 vided in title II of this Act to be merged with and to
23 available for the same purposes and for the same time pe-
24 as the appropriations to which transferred: Provided fur-
25 That obligation and expenditure of these funds are subje

1 the review and approval of the Corporate Information Man-
 2 agement Executive Level Group: Provided further, That this
 3 transfer authority shall be in addition to any other transfer
 4 authority contained in this Act.

5 **(353) STUDIES OF THE TRANSPORTATION OF CHEMICAL**
 6 **WEAPONS**

7 *SEC. 8079. None of the funds available in this or any*
 8 *other Act shall be available for the preparation of studies of*
 9 *the feasibility of removal and transportation of unitary chem-*
 10 *ical munitions and agents stored at any location within the*
 11 *continental United States.*

12 **(354) ENERGY ALLIANCE FUEL RESERVE**

13 *SEC. 8080. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of*
 14 *law, funds made available to the Department of Defense in*
 15 *fiscal year 1991 and thereafter, shall be used to establish and*
 16 *maintain as part of the wartime energy reserve of the United*
 17 *States, a stockpile in Israel for petroleum fuels of military*
 18 *utility equal to 4,500,000 barrels.*

19 *(b) The stockpile referred to in subsection (a) shall be—*

20 *(1) configured to meet the wartime needs and*
 21 *combined military training requirements of the United*
 22 *States and Israel, and*

23 *(2) owned by the United States and operated*
 24 *jointly by the United States Department of Defense*
 25 *and Israel.*

1 *(c) In the event of a wartime emergency or a state*
 2 *heightened military readiness on the part of Israel, the Pre-*
 3 *ident of the United States may direct that Israel be permitt*
 4 *to draw upon all or part of the stockpile of petroleum produ*
 5 *referred to in subsection (a), if the President—*

6 *(1) determines it is in the national interest of t*
 7 *United States, and*

8 *(2) so reports to Congress in accordance with s*
 9 *tion 652 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961*
 10 *amended.*

11 *(d) Negotiations, leading to an agreement by July :*
 12 *1991, shall begin immediately to bring the fuel stockpile*
 13 *ferred to in subsection (a) to full operational readiness*
 14 *later than September 30, 1993.*

15 *(e) For purposes of this section, the term "petrolei*
 16 *product" shall refer to all petroleum, oils and lubricants*
 17 *quired for military operations.*

18 *(f) The provisions of this section are effective imme*
 19 *ately upon the enactment of this Act.*

20 **(355) CLASSIFIED PROVISIONS**

21 *SEC. 8081. (a) The amounts specified for the speci*
 22 *projects, programs, or activities that are to be carried out w*
 23 *funds appropriated by this Act and that are set forth in*
 24 *Classified Annex are hereby incorporated as a part of t*
 25 *Act. Any limitation, requirement, or condition contained*
