



Stand Off Zones Around the Fukushima Nuclear Power Plant



Question: Has the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) established any restricted air space around the Japanese disaster area, especially the nuclear reactors at Fukushima? In addition to flight restrictions, are there any prohibited areas for maritime or land-based travel?

Answer: The only restrictions (Stand-off zone) in and around Japan at this time has been imposed by the C7F Commander and approved by the USFJ Commander. The stand-off area consists of two parts; Part 1 is a 50NM circle around the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant and the second component defined by a wedge that is 22.5 degrees on either side and downwind out to 100NM. There are no flight restrictions in or around Japan at this time. There have been discussions for doing so but nothing implemented as of now.
