



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Afghanistan

- ❖ Defeated the Taliban in Afghanistan (first state sponsor to fall); denied al-Qaida safe haven
- ❖ Deployed 9,000 troops to Afghanistan; additional 43,000 deployed in the region for initial OEF operations
 - N currently 63,184 deployed in USCENTCOM AOR
- ❖ Built a military coalition of 70 nations; 32 nations directly providing troops or assistance for OEF or ISAF
- ❖ Established International Security Assistance Force of 4,745 forces in Kabul
- ❖ Established Joint Task Force-180 to coordinate combat security operations
 - N Transitioning from combat operations to stability operations
- ❖ Detained 2,700 operatives; continue to hold over 600
- ❖ Training the Afghan National Army (started in May 02):



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Global Military Operations

- ❖ Conducting Maritime Interception Operations in Mediterranean, Horn of Africa, and Persian Gulf to disrupt terrorist lines of communication (leadership, weapons, and intelligence)
 - N Coalition effort; (b)(1) U.S. personnel involved
 - N Producing database of links to non-state supporters of terrorists
 - N Led to the capture of 4 persons of interest
 - N Over 3,100 boardings and over 800 diverts
 - N Most recently seized shipment of SCUD missiles off coast of Yemen






Current Military Operations

Organizing for the Long Term

- ❖ Formed Joint Intelligence Task Force _N Combating Terrorism (JITF-CT) to provide DOD all source intelligence [REDACTED]
- ❖ Established Joint Interagency Coordination Groups (JIACG) at Regional Combatant Commands, USSOCOM and USTRANSCOM to enhance Interagency information sharing (roughly 12 personnel per JIACG)
- ❖ Established Counter-Terrorism Campaign Support Group (CT-CSG) to fuse intelligence and operations [REDACTED]
- ❖ Designated USSOCOM as supported Commander for global operational planning [REDACTED]
- ❖ Reviewing force structure for Special Operations Forces






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HLS Forces Status

- ⊗ Joint Intelligence Task Force for Combating Terrorism (JITF-CT) focused on fusing intelligence
- ⊗ Counterterrorism Campaign Support Group (CTCSG) stood-up and focused on integrating intelligence and operations
- ⊗ Briefed initiative through key Deputies
- ⊗ Ready for Principals

Approach

- ⊗ First: Streamline internal US government approval process by:
 - N Focus efforts on a limited number of terrorists
 - N Integrating intelligence & operational planning
 - N Use pre-approved authorities and a rapid decision making process
 - N Match best US and foreign resource to each mission
- ⊗ Then: Develop strategies to obtain host nation consent on a case-by-case basis for selected countries to conduct necessary operations

- ❖ CDR USCENTCOM ready to shift to Phase IV stability operations in Afghanistan
- ❖ Has proposed deploying combined interagency and coalition Joint Regional Teams to eight regions in Afghanistan
- ❖ The Joint Regional Teams will assist with the cooperation and exchange of information with local leaders, police, border guards, and Afghan National Army
- ❖ Coalition partners have already expressed a desire to participate in Joint Regional Teams
- ❖ Civil Affairs teams developing 242 humanitarian projects



Iraq

UN Monitoring, Verification, and Inspection Commission (UNMOVIC)

✘ Earlier this week, the UNMOVIC was briefed on US readiness to support their mission with a concept of operations for aerial surveillance support using U-2 and Predator aircraft

Weapons Inspections

✘ In an effort to ensure the safety of the UN Weapons Inspectors, procedures have been developed to deconflict ongoing Operation Northern Watch and Operation Southern Watch missions with inspector activities

War Preparations

✘ Planning continues in the event military force is necessary in Iraq

✘ US maintaining a sizable and growing force presence in the region

✘ Military presence serves as credible deterrent to potential terrorists operating from Iraq

✘ Coalition support for access, basing, overflight, and forces being sought

✘ Coalition involvement is key to victory in Iraq

✘ International support for US counterterrorism efforts essential
