SUBJECT: Your East Asian Travel (U) - ACTION MEMORANDUM

~~(C)~~ You recently agreed to travel to Northeast Asia in March-April 1982. This would provide the opportunity to attend the SCM. The Koreans are most anxious to host you in Seoul and would accommodate any schedule you propose. A stopover in Tokyo will establish a personal relationship with your new counterpart, and, if you agree, provide an opportunity to deliver a presentation in a suitable forum covering our national and economic security interests in Asia. Additionally, if our defense relationship progresses satisfactorily, the Chinese may be amenable to a stop in Beijing to develop further an understanding and sharing of our mutual defense interests.* Secretary Haig would precede you to Beijing in February. The attached itinerary at attachment 1 outlines some proposed travel dates to include the SCM.

~~(C)~~ If the US/PRC relationship has not stabilized and you are not invited to visit China, travel to Korea and Japan could still be arranged during the same general time frames. As you are aware, Mr. Carlucci's visit to these two countries was very successful and both the Koreans and Japanese are anxiously awaiting your first visit to their countries as Secretary of Defense. You still have the opportunity to make a presentation in Japan if you desire. The itinerary at attachment 2 outlines proposed travel dates for this option.

* Judging from Rich Armitage's report on his trip to Peking with Holdbridge, the chances of you going to Peking this spring are still quite uncertain.
