This investigation was initiated subsequent notification by the Office of the Staff Judge Advocate, 3rd Battalion, 3rd Special Forces Group, Kandahar Airfield, APO AE 09355 (KAF), who reported a local national being detained by U.S. Special Forces (USSF), and guarded by the Afghanistan Militia Forces (AMF), at Forward Operating Base (FOB) Gereshk, Helmond Province, Afghanistan (AF), was discovered by an AMF guard deceased on the floor of the holding area.

Investigation disclosed that on 6 Nov 03, WAHID had been discovered by an AMF guard unresponsive in a crumpled position in the detainment facility, FOB Gereshk, AF. USSF personnel conducted an initial medical examination of WAHID and determined that WAHID had expired. WAHID had been in custody of the AMF for an undetermined period of time prior to being turned over to USSF personnel. Upon receipt of WAHID by USSF personnel at FOB Gereshk, AF, the USSF medics documented numerous bruises to WAHID's groin area, buttocks, hips and injuries which appeared to be burn type injuries to his chest. Approximately 48 hours after being turned over to USSF personnel, WAHID expired. On 13 Nov 03, an autopsy was conducted on the remains of WAHID which disclosed the cause of WAHID's death as Multiple Blunt Force injuries complicated by Rhabdomyolysis, and the manner of death was homicide.

Further investigation revealed that from the onset of Rhabdomyolysis to the time of WAHID's death, Rhabdomyolysis was consistent with the type of injuries WAHID had received prior to USSF custody which caused his death within the 48 hours.

Further investigation disclosed that the facts of the investigation did not support the offense of Murder, which was subsequently unfounded. However, investigation did support the offenses of Aggravated Assault and Torture as committed by the unknown AMF personnel, which ultimately led to the death of WAHID.

"THIS IS A DETAINEE ABUSE INVESTIGATION."

1ST SUPPLEMENTAL:

THE PURPOSE OF THIS SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT IS TO DOCUMENT THE REOPENING OF THIS INVESTIGATION TO ADD ADDITIONAL OFFENSES AND TO UNFOUND THE OFFENSE OF MURDER PERTAINING TO THE UNKNOWN AMF PERSONNEL.

ON 2 MAR 05, THIS OFFICE RECEIVED A REQUEST FOR CORRECTION (0128-05-CID001) FROM HQUSACIDC IN WHICH THE DETAINEE ABUSE TASK FORCE (DATF), USACIDC, DOCUMENTED THEIR FINDINGS DURING THEIR REVIEW OF THIS INVESTIGATION. DURING THEIR REVIEW, IT WAS NOTED THERE WAS NO EVIDENCE IN THE INVESTIGATION TO SUPPORT THE OFFENSE OF MURDER IN THAT SPECIFIC INTENT COULD NOT BE ESTABLISHED. FURTHERMORE, IT WAS NOTED THAT A SECOND INCIDENT BE ADDED TO ENCOMPASS THE PERIOD BEFORE WAHID'S RELEASE TO THE USSF, AND TO LIST THE OFFENSES OF AGGRAVATED ASSAULT AND TORTURE AS IT PERTAINS TO THE UNKNOWN AMF PERSONNEL. THEREFORE, THIS REPORT REFLECTS THE RECOMMENDATIONS AND REQUEST FOR CORRECTIONS BY THE DATF.

ON 3 MAR 05, COORDINATION WAS EFFECTED WITH THE OFFICE OF THE STAFF JUDGE ADVOCATE, KAF, WHO CONCURRED WITH THE FINDINGS OF THE DATF IN THAT PROBABLE CAUSE EXISTS TO BELIEVE THE UNKNOWN AMF PERSONNEL COMMITTED THE OFFENSES OF AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, TORTURE AND VOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER, WHEN THE UNKNOWN AMF PERSONNEL ASSAULTED AND TORTURED WAHID WHICH CONTRIBUTED TO HIS DEATH.

THE AFGHANISTAN MILITIA FORCES (AMF), AT FORWARD OPERATING BASE (FOB) GERESHK, HELMOND PROVINCE, AFGHANISTAN (AF), WAS DISCOVERED BY AN AMF GUARD DECEASED ON THE FLOOR OF THE HOLDING AREA.

INVESTIGATION DISCLOSED THAT ON 6 NOV 03, WAHID HAD BEEN DISCOVERED BY AN AMF GUARD UNRESPONSIVE IN A CRUMPLED POSITION IN THE DETAINMENT FACILITY, FOB GERESHK, AF. USSF PERSONNEL CONDUCTED AN INITIAL MEDICAL EXAMINATION OF WAHID AND DETERMINED THAT WAHID HAD EXPIRED. WAHID HAD BEEN IN CUSTODY OF THE AMF FOR AN UNDETERMINED PERIOD OF TIME PRIOR TO BEING TURNED OVER TO USSF PERSONNEL. UPON RECEIPT OF WAHID BY USSF PERSONNEL AT FOB GERESHK, AF, THE USSF MEDICS DOCUMENTED NUMEROUS BRUISES TO WAHID'S GROIN AREA, BUTTOCKS, HIPS AND INJURIES WHICH APPEARED TO BE BURN TYPE INJURIES TO HIS CHEST. ON 13 NOV 03, AN AUTOPSY WAS CONDUCTED ON THE REMAINS OF WAHID WHICH DISCLOSED THE CAUSE OF WAHID'S DEATH AS MULTIPLE BLUNT FORCE INJURIES COMPLICATED BY RHABDOMYOLYSIS, AND THE MANNER OF DEATH WAS HOMICIDE.

FURTHER INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT FROM THE ONSET OF RHABDOMYOLYSIS TO THE TIME OF WAHID'S DEATH, RHABDOMYOLYSIS WAS CONSISTENT WITH THE TYPE OF INJURIES WAHID HAD RECEIVED PRIOR TO USSF CUSTODY WHICH CAUSED HIS DEATH WITHIN THE 48 HOURS.

7. COMMANDERS ARE REMINDED OF THE PROVISIONS OF AR 600-8-2 PERTAINING TO SUSPENSION OF FAVORABLE PERSONNEL ACTIONS AND AR 380-67 FOR THE SUSPENSION OF SECURITY CLEARANCES OF PERSONS UNDER INVESTIGATION.

8. USACIDC REPORTS ARE EXEMPT FROM AUTOMATIC TERMINATION OF PROTECTIVE MARKINGS IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 3, AR 25-55.

About 2150, 6 Nov 03, This investigation was initiated upon notification by CPT [REDACTED], Office of the Staff Judge Advocate, 3rd [REDACTED] 67C-3,66-3 Battalion, 3rd Special Forces Group (SFG), Kandahar Air Field, APO AE 09355 (KAF), who reported a local national, being detained by US Special Forces (AMF), at Forward Operating Base (FOB) Gereshk, Helmond Province, Afghanistan (AF), WAHID was discovered by an AMF guard crumpled on the floor of a holding area, believed to be dead.

About 0005, 7 Nov 03, SA [REDACTED] and SA [REDACTED], Criminal Investigative Task Force (CITF), CPT [REDACTED], and MAJ (DR) [REDACTED] 67C-3,66-3 [REDACTED] Battalion Surgeon, 3rd Battalion, 3rd SFG, traveled via rotary wing aircraft to FOB Gereshk. Prior to departing it was learned the remains of Mr. WAHID had been released to the family for burial.

About 0100, 7 Nov 03, SA [REDACTED] interviewed SFC [REDACTED], [REDACTED] A Company (CO), 3rd BN, 3rd SFG, FOB Gereshk. SFC [REDACTED] was identified as the Special Forces medic who had been notified upon the discovery of Mr. WAHID. SFC [REDACTED] related he conducted a preliminary assessment and based on the onset of rigor mortis no lifesaving measures were initiated. (See Statement)

About 0215, 7 Nov 03, SA [REDACTED] interviewed SFC [REDACTED], [REDACTED] A CO, 3rd BN, 3rd SFG, FOB Gereshk. SFC [REDACTED] was identified as the individual who had initially received Mr. WAHID upon his arrival at the FOB at which time WAHID was photographed and medically examined and the presence of the existing injuries were identified. SFC [REDACTED] was further identified as the last U.S. Service Member (SM), who had seen Mr. WAHID alive. (See Statement/Photographs and Medical Record for further details)

About 0412, 7 Nov 03, SA [REDACTED] interviewed SSG [REDACTED], [REDACTED] A CO 3rd BN, 3rd SFG, who related he had conducted the interrogation of Mr. WAHID while in SFG control. (See Statement)

About 0230, 7 Nov 03, SA [REDACTED], Criminal Investigations Task Force (CITF), Kandahar Airfield, Kandahar, Afghanistan, APO AE 09355 (KAF) conducted a crime scene examination of the detainee area, located three feet from the main entrance into Forward Operating Base (FOB) Gereshk, Helmand Province, AF. *b7c-1,66-1,62*

Characteristics of the Scene: The area identified, as the detainee area was a plywood structure shaped octagonally, with approximately four foot high cubicles. The cubicle areas had a ceiling (about 3' x 4'), and was open in the center of the structure. The area was free of debris and appeared clean. There was a folding metal chair, resting upright on the floor, and centered on the west wall, and a box, which contained bottled drinking water. The structure was unpainted and was constructed of treated plywood. There was an entrance and exit (E/E), which was merely a 2" x 4" piece of wood, which made a forced a person to bend at the waist to enter the structure. There was no door, nor were there any locks to keep a person from leaving. However, the structure was surrounded by concertina wire, and two Afghanistan Militia Forces (AMF) soldiers, who were stationed inside the detainee area, guarded the area. The guard area merely consisted of a holding area with the structure, and the folding metal chair. The over-watch of the detainee facility was being performed the U.S. Special Forces (USSF) unit assigned to the FOB positioned in a guard tower approximately 100 meters inside the base which was approximately 50 meters in height.

Condition of the Scene: The scene was clean of dirt, and there were several empty bottles of water laid on the floor of the detainee areas at the time of the examination, there was only one detainee sleeping in a cell of the structure. The detainee area was structurally sound, and appeared unsecured, besides the guards positioned inside the structure guarding the detainee. There was also a heat source in another of the cells, which was not operating at the time of the examination.





About 1200, 7 May 04, the undersigned, briefed CPT [REDACTED], Office of Staff Judge Advocate (SJA), Kandahar Air Field (KAF), Afghanistan, on the status of this investigation. CPT [REDACTED] opined Mr. WAHID's death was a result of injuries he received in the custody of the Afghanistan Militia Force (AMF), and there had been no wrong doing by the American Forces.

About 0930, 12 May 04, the undersigned, received an electronic generated Final Autopsy Report, substitute for SF 503, A03-144, which indicated that the cause of Mr. WAHID's death was Multiple Blunt Force Injuries complicated by Rhabdomyolysis, and the manner of death was Homicide. (See Final Autopsy Report for further details)

About 1000, 13 Jun 04, the undersigned coordinated with LTC [REDACTED], Armed Forces Regional Medical Examiner, Landstuhl Regional Medical Center, GE, who related in her medical opinion Mr. WAHID's injuries would have caused rhabdomyolysis, which would have set in about 24 to 48 hours causing Mr. WAHID to expire. Which is consistent with the time frame from which Mr. WAHID was handed over from AMF custody to USSF personnel. LTC [REDACTED] further related during the autopsy no other injuries were discovered after the documented injuries had occurred.

A. There is an initial questioning involving background history, a medical assessment, which involves a full body medical assessment, and then they are taken to their cells, to await interrogation.

Q. Who conducted the medical assessment of WAHID?

A. SFC [REDACTED]

Q. How were you notified of WAHID's death?

A. Someone, who I can't remember came in and told me that a detainee had died and then I went and observed him, he was outside the PUC hooch, on the ground, covered by a blanket, lying on his back, supine position, he looked like he had been sleeping, so I checked his heartbeat and found none, then I inspected his mouth, to make sure that he didn't choke on anything.

- A. The large one was about 1" X 1", the smaller ones varied in size.

- A. I was told SFC [REDACTED] that the injuries were inflicted by Afghan Militia Forces.

- A. I went through the 18D course.
- Q. Do you know the doctor who examined WAHID at the time of his death?

2. As of 21 May 04, this Command has initiated 74 Reports of Investigation (ROI) in Afghanistan and Iraq concerning the abuse of detained persons by U.S. military and civilian contracted personnel. These investigations have generated significant Department of Defense, Congressional, and international attention. Several Congressional and Department of Defense task forces and commissions have been created to review divergent aspects of detainee operations as well as investigations conducted by the USACIDC. It is expected this scrutiny and oversight will continue for the foreseeable future.

3. Effective 25 May 04, the Commanding General, USACIDC, has designated all detainee abuse ROIs as category I monitorship. All field elements are directed to reference 1b for timeliness and timely reporting requirements. In addition, all ROIs dispatched effective this date will be SSI reportable and will reflect the following statement as the first paragraph of the investigative summary, "This is a detainee abuse investigation."

4. For the purposes of this requirement a "detainee" is defined as any person captured or otherwise detained by an armed force. The detention need not occur at a MP controlled detention facility and may include checkpoints and cordon and search operations. "Abuse" includes, but is not limited to, punitive articles of the Uniform Code of Military Justice and/or similar provisions of Title 18, US Code.

> Troops,

> I know that all of you are aware that detainee abuse issues are at the
> forefront right now and that our associated criminal investigations are
> very, very important pieces to resolving the overall issues. Let there be

This investigation was initiated upon notification by CPT [REDACTED], Office of the Staff Judge Advocate, 3rd Battalion, 3rd Special Forces Group, Kandahar Air Field, APO AE 09355 (KAF), who reported a local national, being detained by US Special Forces (USSF), and guarded by the Afghanistan Militia Forces (AMF), at the Forward Operating Base (FOB) Gereshk, Helmand Province, Afghanistan (AF), WAHID was discovered by an AMF guard crumpled on the floor of a holding area deceased. *b7C-3, 66-3*

3. Efforts to conduct follow-on interviews of three individuals assigned to FOB Gereshk, AF who had direct contact with WAHID have met with negative results.

4. Request your office conduct follow-up interviews of the following individuals: SFC [REDACTED], SFC [REDACTED], and SSG [REDACTED], all of A Company, 3/3rd Special Forces Group, Ft Bragg, NC 28310. Specifically request the questioning to focus on the specifics of their personal interaction with WAHID, specifically any complaints and the nature of them, the depth of the physical assessment upon receipt of WAHID at FOB Gereshk, AF and if there is a Standard Operating Procedure pertaining the receipt and processing of PUC's upon their arrival at the FOB. *b7C-3, 66-3*

Hey it's [REDACTED] I can provide some limited detail about the interviews/interrogations (understanding that this is off the record, due to classification of Intel reports). WAHID was a Taliban operative (working in assassination and coalition force disruption). I can't say much more than that without compromising the reports. Now something to remember is that he confessed to this to the AMF (under duress and an ass whopping), and reiterated this to USSF at the FOB. He would have been sent forward to KAF or BAF detention, for future interrogation had he lived. There is currently no Afghani law against AMF beating there people down (although, we frown against it) during interrogations - we see it a lot.

Reason no callalous' to his hands and feet is due to the nature of his business and local society. Think about this? A US Soldier climbs up and down hills and gets blisters, and [REDACTED] climbs the same hills and never breaks a sweat, why? He/she is used to it. Question I have for you to consider is how do you charge [REDACTED] AMF for murder if they committed this crime (only illegal in the states and *b7c-3, b6-3* other civilized countries ha, ha)? Also, the M.E. finished her autopsy before the weekend. She ruled Manner of Death "Homicide." I will try to update my AAS entries in that file. Get your IP ready in ACIRS, so I can take a look at what you have planned. I will print out an IP up here, and put it in the case file. You can work off another copy. You will need to go back out to the FOB, or call those guys in, whichever you can work out. We need specific questions about this guys condition, behavior. One of the big questions, of course, is make sure nothing further was done to this guy after he arrived in the FOB. Since he is dead, I don't think it will comprmise anything if you ask them who this guy was. He obviously wasn't a foot soldier in Taliban/Al Quada because his feet and hands did not appear to be callused. We need to find out why they didn't just turn him back to the Afghani's. It appears that the medic or somebody missed it in the evaluation that this guy was in serious condition. The doc's Cause of Death was Blunt Force Trauma /Complicated by Probable Rhabdomyolysis. I haven't done any research on it, but according to the guys, who attended the autopsy, this means that the kidneys/liver were not able to filter out all of the toxins created in the blood as his body reacted to all the destroyed muscle tissue. In the healing process, there is apperently a lot of acid released, and there was so much acid released, that his kidneys/liver were not able to filter it out sufficiently, and he died as a result.

I was getting ready to do a Status ROI changing manner from Undetermined to Homicide, based on the Death Certificate and Preliminary Autopsy Report. I gave Mr [REDACTED] a heads up I was about to do this. He said hold the presses; let's wait for the Final Autopsy Report. But, consider it a Homicide case. You need to resort to the old 72/48/24 hour time line on this guy. You will probably have trouble with the 72 to 48 hours, but give it a good shot. Balls back in your court.

Chief: I am about to do a Status ROI on the death case involving the Afghani who died at the Special Forces forward operating base. The Regional M.E. and her team performed their forensic autopsy on Thursday; which we attended. On Saturday, 15 Nov 03, she provided us with her Preliminary Autopsy Report, which states the Manner of Death is Homicide, with Cause of Death listed as "Multiple Blunt Force Injuries Complicated by Probable Rhabdomyolysis." She also provided us with an overseas Certificate of Death, which has the same Manner and Cause.

She related to us that the victim died because his system, primarily kidneys and liver, were not able to filter the higher than normal level of toxins produced when his body tried to heal the massive muscle damage inflicted on him before he was transported to the SF FOB.

Besides giving you a heads-up, I also just double checking with you. I have had some instances where we (CID) would prefer to wait until we receive the Final Autopsy Report before we go with the status changing from Undetermined; however, I don't feel this is a problem in this case because the M.E. already provided a Certificate of Death.

Chief,
We received notification about 2130, 6 Nov 03, by 2400, 6 Nov 03, we were on a Black Hawk helicopter to a fire base about 30 minutes flight time northeast of Kandahar. We did a hot landing, basically they pushed us and our equipment out of the aircraft and took off. We were met by two HUMVEE's with 50 Cal machineguns mounted on them. We went to this God forsaken fire base where we were told until a few hours ago this guy was alive and apparently doing okay. Nobody saw this guy in any kind of distress. If necessary I will go back out there and talk to everyone that was in the compound at the time of his untimely demise. To date there sure hasn't happened too much for you to have any confidence in me but I did everything I thought we were suppose to do. There wasn't any indication of foul play, as related by three SF medics, a SF Intel guy, and two physicians. I don't know if this whole autopsy thing was just done so that this wouldn't happen and it happened anyway. I haven't seen an SOP that tells me that PUC's in our facilities get autopsied by a Medical Examiner. I did coordinate with Mortuary Affairs and explained to them they are not to release the remains until they've talked to me. Am I to understand the CJTF180 Surgeon is making arrangements to have a ME brought in? Anyway I know sorry doesn't fix but I certainly know enough of what needs to be done to believe I was doing it before this blew up in our face. I'm still in my office and will be until you call.

Chief,
I just finished talking to CPT [REDACTED], SF's SJA, and he explained the decision to conduct the autopsy was coordinated, beginning with LTC [REDACTED], Commander, 3rd Battalion, 3rd Special Forces Group, then to CJTF180, CJSOTIF, and all the way back to Ft Bragg, NC. He also explained because that SF Team does a lot of humanitarian work out there at the fire base they have had a few local nationals, excuse the term, expire on them. He, the SF Team Commander, a CPT, didn't think anything of it to release the body. It was after the report went up that he was told that's not the way it's done so he requested the family return the remains. It was MAJ (Dr) [REDACTED], Battalion Surgeon, 3rd Battalion, 3rd Special Forces Group, KAF, that went out to the fire base with us and conducted the preliminary physical examination on the remains. The decision to use LTC (Dr) [REDACTED] 10th Mtn Div, was made as he was the most qualified person in theatre. The remains are currently located on KAF, at mortuary affairs, and I can certainly stop any movement of them if a ME is required. Again in my own defense I had people, much more qualified than I, render professional medical opinions that there were no outward signs of anything criminal. This PUC, Mr Abdul WAHID, until he was discovered had been responsive, moving under his own power, and did not exhibit any signs of distress. I know it may appear that I left a lot out of this but again I had three Special Forces Medics and two physicians tell me that there were no external signs of foul play. Based on the extent of the beating this guy received before he even arrived at the fire base I'm surprise he lasted as long as he did. I will attach some photographs so you can get an idea of the extent of the injuries.

The two images I have attached to this e-mail are of the injuries he presented to the fire base with. I will send a second e-mail with images of how we found him this morning.

I'm in the office, 1715Z, 6 Nov 03, and I just got notified a few minutes ago of an undetermined death. The Special Forces SJA came by and said he just got notified that earlier this evening, a Person Under Control (PUC), located at the Geresh Forward Operating Base (FOB), that had been turned over by the Afghanistan Military Forces (AMF), was alive. Later in the day they went back to feed and water him and we was discovered dead. Tomorrow morning at about first light I will be heading out with a convoy that includes, probably, the Commander of the SF Group that's hear, a medical doctor, myself, SF SJA, and a few other strap hangers to get the details. As it stands right now that is about all we have. We were told that the PUC may have been a High Value Target (HVT) as it is believed he confessed to involvement in a number of actions against coalition forces. SA [redacted] says he's going too and of course I didn't discourage him as he has more experience with the PUC side of the house. I've tried to call but you number is busy. I am going to continue trying but if you get this message before I get a hold of you I should be here for a little while longer.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Operational Review of 0174-03-CID369-49232

1. On 10 May 04, this office received a Request for Investigation (0212-04-CID001) from Headquarters, USACIDC, requesting this office to conduct an operational review of all detainee deaths and other crimes against detainees by U.S. Military personnel.

2. On 18 May 04, the undersigned conducted an operational review of the above referenced Report of Investigation (ROI) and determined that it was operationally insufficient. This ROI was initiated on 6 Nov 03, and the undersigned assumed operational responsibility of the ROI on 20 Apr 04. Even though this is an open investigation, some of the investigative leads should have been accomplished prior to 20 Apr 04. There were no operational reviews conducted on this ROI prior to 20 Apr 04. During the operational review, the following investigative leads were identified as being outstanding:

a. Locate, fully identify, and interview Dr. (MAJ) [REDACTED] (conducted the examination of Mr. WAHID after his death). *b7c-3, 66-3*

b. Pending an RFA which was forwarded to Ft Bragg Resident Agency on 4 Feb 04, to re-interview three Special Forces personnel who had direct contact with the decedent. A 2nd RFA is forthcoming to Ft Bragg RA, in order to ensure they ask specific questions of the interviewees, which was not originally detailed in the original RFA.

c. No canvass interviews were conducted during the preliminary investigation.

d. No documentation showing that death scene photographs were exposed.

e. Coordination with the pathologist, Landstuhl Regional Medical Center, to inquire if the pathologist could determine if the injuries which eventually caused the demise of Mr. WAHID, could corroborate the interviews of U.S. military personnel in that the injuries were caused by Afghan Military Forces (AMF).

f. This investigation was also administratively insufficient, and is currently being adjusted to meet the standards of CIDR 195-1 and FM 19-20.

3. All indications and facts are leaning toward the AMF causing the injuries, which eventually led to the demise of Mr. WAHID. After the above leads are accomplished, and there is no other indication of U.S. military personnel involvement in the death or abuse of Mr. WAHID, this a Status Report will be generated changing the unknown subject to an unknown Afghan Military Forces subject, and then a Final Report will be dispatched.
