1. JP 3-63. COL (R) [REDACTED] (b)(6)-2 responded back regarding yesterday's RFI on JP 3-63. He reports that **USAMPS has been designated as the Joint lead for JP 3-63, "Detainee Operations,"** which is reportedly an operation-level pub rather than its DRAFT ALSA predecessor, which is much more tactical. Ed Lowe has the lead and we will receive timelines and specifics on this project to include members/staffing/review/ and policy lash-up with our "Corrections Branch," etc. **Project specifics will help both sides of the house synchronize policy and doctrine and hasten implementation of TNG-to-field OPS.**

2. Doctrine Changes. He also provided a Doctrine Crosswalk, which references our Gap findings to FM 3-19.40. **USAMPS has highlighted a couple of discrete doctrinal changes: (1) Detainee Categorization Terminology and (2) MP/MI C2 lash-up/relationship.** We will review their analysis with respect to our Rapid Revision of AR 190-8.

3. Interim Guidance AR 190-8. **Timeline for Rapid Revision of AR 190-8** (Corrections B. lead/Initiatives in SPT) is set for Interim Brief to you o/a 15 Jul 04 and Final Product Brief to you prior to staffing o/a 23 Jul 04. I will work your calendar with XO [REDACTED]

The Detainee Ombudsman shall be a general or flag officer who will report directly to the Secretary and Deputy Secretary of Defense. The Detainee Ombudsman will provide oversight of detainee operations worldwide as part of the global war on terrorism to include, evaluating and reporting treatment of detainees, recommending standards for proper and humane treatment, identifying and disseminating best practices, visiting DoD detention facilities, and other duties as specified by the Secretary of Defense.

If OSD establishes an Office of Detainee Ombudsmen, recommend that a Military Police General Officer be appointed as Detainee Ombudsman and that detainee accountability/reporting be distributed through the National Detainee Reporting Center (NDRC) to OSD in accordance with multi-Service regulation, AR 190-8.

Issue: The establishment of a Detainee Ombudsman will create redundancy to Army's EA responsibilities for detainee reporting and accountability. A separate office within OSD will require additional manning and resources and may preclude detainee reporting and accountability already provided by Army NDRC.

Objectives:

- Expand Army's EA role for detainee oversight to incorporate additional Detainee Ombudsman responsibilities, as outlined in SECDEF MEMO "Detainee Ombudsman Program," in lieu of establishing an Office of Detainee Ombudsman.
- Since the Army already exercises many of the proposed Detainee Ombudsman responsibilities, expanding its EA role will require less additional manning and resources, while leveraging existing regulations, systems, and Army NDRC/Corrections expertise to provide new detainee oversight requirements.
- If OSD establishes an Office of Detainee Ombudsman, appoint an MP General Officer as Ombudsman and continue to distribute detainee reporting and accountability thru NDRC to the Office of Detainee Ombudsman.



1. Purpose. To provide information concerning the death of MG Mowhoush while in the custody of US Forces personnel.

2. Background.

(b)(6)-3
a. On 10 Nov 03, MG Mowhoush, identified as a former member of the Saddam Hussein regime, was detained by coalition forces and transported to a temporary detention facility. Witness interviews have disclosed between 10 – 24 Nov 03, CW3 [REDACTED] interrogated MG Mowhoush at least once, and often times more than once a day. On 24 Nov 03, MG Mowhoush was interrogated by unidentified OGA personnel. During this interrogation, personnel assigned to the 66th Military Intelligence Company overheard what were believed to be physical blows and cries of anguish from MG Mowhoush. On 26 Nov 03, MG Mowhoush was interrogated by CW3 [REDACTED] and CW2 [REDACTED], 66th MI Co with SFC [REDACTED] (also assigned to the 66th MI Co) and SPC [REDACTED], Aviation Maintenance Troop, Support Squadron, 3d Armored Cavalry Regiment, present in the room. The 66th MI Co is a subordinate unit of the Support Squadron, 3d Armored Cavalry Regiment, Fort Carson, CO. During this interrogation, CW2 [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED], at the direction of CW3 Welshofer, placed MG Mowhoush in a sleeping bag. SPC [REDACTED] tied an electrical cord around MG Mowhoush and placed him in a sleeping bag. MG Mowhoush was then placed on his back while CW3 Welshofer sat on his abdomen, placed his hands over his eyes and mouth, and continued the interrogation. MG Mowhoush appeared to start convulsing. CW3 Welshofer then rolled MG Mowhoush on his stomach and sat on his back continuing the interrogation. MG Mowhoush subsequently died during this technique. On 2 Dec 03, an autopsy was performed by the Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner, Institute of Pathology which disclosed MG Mowhoush died of asphyxia due to smothering and chest compression. The manner of death was homicide. Further investigation by CID determined credible information exists to believe CW3 Welshofer committed the offense of involuntary manslaughter; CW2 Williams committed the offense of negligent homicide and dereliction of duty; and SFC Sommer and SPC Loper committed the offense of dereliction of duty. Although the investigation into all the alleged assaults on MG Mowhoush continues, the chain of command has been provided information regarding the four Soldiers.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

(U) HQDA Detainee Operations, DTG 221500JUN04, HQDA has aggressively supported the Office of Secretary of Defense, Members of Congress, Joint Staff, CENTCOM Combatant Commander, and media in regard to detainee operations. The Army is conducting compressive internal investigations and is supporting CENTCOM's Detainee Abuse Investigations and has taken a holistic view of Detainee Operations from the point of capture through release. Below is a sample of the Department of the Army contributions to this effort.

Media Support:

- Of 1050 total queries over the past 7 weeks, fielded over 540 media queries on Detainee Abuse Issues (51%)
 - 270 inquires on investigations (50%)
 - 135 inquires on UCMJ issues (25%)

ALLEGATIONS OF MISTREATMENT of IRAQI PRISONERS

Question. Secretary Rumsfeld, *The Denver Post* reports an allegation that the former head of the Iraqi Air Force died during interrogation when he was rolled up inside a sleeping bag so only his feet stuck out, and then sat on and rolled back and forth until he died of suffocation. Apparently the investigation concluded that this was a death from "natural causes." What can you tell us about this?

Answer. The case concerns Major General Mowhosh, the former Iraqi Air Defense commander. General Mowhosh died on November 26, 2003 at Forward Operating Base Tiger, in western Iraq in the area of the 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment. The U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command (CID) was notified of the death and initiated an investigation that same day. The Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner (OAFME) performed an autopsy on December 2, 2003, with preliminary indications that the manner of death was a homicide and the cause of death was asphyxia. OAFME issued a death certificate on May 12, 2004.

CID investigation determined that on November 26, 2003, General Mowhosh had been subjected to interrogation by two Army Military Intelligence warrant officers. General Mowhosh was allegedly placed in a sleeping bag, and then bound in the bag to prevent his movement. One of the warrant officers reportedly sat on his chest and continued the interrogation. General Mowhosh was then rolled over and the warrant officer sat on his back. It was during this procedure that General Mowhosh is believed to have died. As of this date, the on-going CID investigation has listed the warrant officers for involuntary manslaughter and negligent homicide, and two enlisted Soldiers present during the interrogation for dereliction of duty.

The CID investigation also indicates that on November 24, 2003, U.S. Special Operations subjected General Mowhosh to an interrogation that may have involved physical assault(s). The investigation continues.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

(U) ARMY COURT-MARTIAL COMPLETED IN CASE OF PFC EDWARD RICHMOND. On 5 August, following a two-day contested General Court-Martial convened by the Commander, 1st Infantry Division, a court-martial panel consisting of five officer and five enlisted members convicted PFC Edward Richmond of voluntary manslaughter. Richmond was charged with the unpremeditated murder of an Iraqi detainee who was apprehended and flex-cuffed by unit personnel following a cordon and search operation on 28 Feb 04, vicinity Taal Al Jal, Iraq. Richmond was assigned to HHC, 1/27th Infantry Battalion, 25th ID at the time. The panel found Richmond not guilty of murder, but guilty of the lesser-included offense of voluntary manslaughter and sentenced him to a dishonorable discharge, forfeiture of all pay and allowance, reduction to Private (E-1), and three years confinement. The Commander, 1st Infantry Division must review the case and sentence, and, if approved, the Army Court of Criminal Appeals will review the case on appeal. This case is the first tried involving the alleged murder of an Iraqi detainee, but has not received extensive media coverage, as it does not involve misconduct inside a detention facility and perhaps because it was tried in Tikrit. There is Army Times media interest. (U)

(U) DTG 091100AUG04. How should we respond to the 14 Jul 04 Denver Post editorial, "Does Army Treat Abuse Seriously"?

(U) Originator: Mr. Geren

(U) Answer. Any response by OSD or HQDA should be tempered by the fact that there are four Soldiers facing charges under the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ). Military law prohibits any attempt to influence court-martial findings or sentences, and discourages even the appearance of doing so. If a response is deemed to be appropriate from a public affairs perspective, the following points are noted:

- o The response would be so tardy as to be ineffective.
- o There is a clear difference in culpability between Soldiers who commit assault and manslaughter and Soldiers who impede a subsequent investigation.
- o One of the Soldiers charged with assault and manslaughter is an officer. His case is being handled in the same way as the enlisted soldiers who have similar charges.
- o The facts of the case are being made part of the public record through evidence being given at pretrial hearings under the provisions of Article 32, UCMJ.
- o The reprimanded officers have privacy rights that are protected by federal law and would likely limit the amount of material that could be disclosed to explain the disposition decision.

INFORMATION PAPER Detainee Operations

SUBJECT: CFLCC Commander's Role in Detainee and Operations and Intelligence Oversight

BACKGROUND: Commander of CFLCC requested clarification of his role and responsibilities for detainee operations and intelligence oversight. The context of this request was to clarify CFLCC's role, with respect to the Secretary of the Army's role as Executive Agent (EA) for the EPOW and Detainee Program, to provide detainee and interrogation operations in support of the combatant commander. He also requested clarification of his role and responsibilities for intelligence oversight, particularly regarding reporting and investigating allegations of questionable intelligence activity as they relate to detainee operations.

MAJOR POINTS:

1. Detainee Operations:

- As the EA for detainee operations, SA is responsible for developing policy and planning guidance for Detainee Operations in support of Combatant Commands. As it applies to Detainee Operations and, in accordance with Title 10 U.S.C., SA is also responsible for providing organized, trained and equipped forces in support of combatant commanders.
- Combatant commanders are responsible for executing detainee operations within their Area of Responsibility (AOR). The combatant commander can organize forces as necessary to "provide for the proper treatment, classification, administrative processing, and custody of those persons captured or detained by the Military Services under their command and control," in accordance with DOD (DODD) Directive 2310.1 and AR 190-8.
- As a Combatant Command, CENTCOM could organize and give CFLCC responsibility for conducting detainee operations in the CENTCOM AOR. As such, CFLCC's responsibility would be an extension of CENTCOM's operational authority and not an extension of the Army's EA or Title 10 responsibilities. CFLCC's only role, with respect to EA responsibility for Detainee Operations, would be promulgation of Detainee Program policy and planning guidance to ensure that all detainees are accounted for and humanely treated, and that collection, evacuation, internment, transfers, release, and repatriation operations are conducted per AR 190-8.

2. Intelligence Oversight:

- Intelligence oversight responsibility is vested in every DoD entity that has intelligence assets or conducts intelligence operations per DoD 5240.1-R. It obligates all DoD employees to report any conduct, by an individual or an entity, that constitutes—or is related to—an intelligence activity that may violate the law, any executive order or Presidential directive, or any applicable DoD policy. Additionally, CJCSI 5901.01 charges combatant commanders with conducting inquiries or investigations, as warranted, for allegations in units OPCON to the combatant command.
- An allegation of questionable activity must be reported regardless of whether it is substantiated or not. Per a 2 Jun 2004 ATSD-IO memo, all allegations concerning misconduct or

abuse of detainees by DoD intelligence personnel or assigned contractor personnel will be passed through Inspector General channels immediately to the ATSD-IO. Each report of questionable activity shall be investigated to the extent necessary to determine the facts and assess whether the activity is legal and is consistent with applicable policy.

- Army units OPCON to a combatant command should report allegations through the combatant command chain, with an information copy through the Army chain of command to the HQDA DCS, G2. Army units not OPCON to a combatant command or a subordinate task force, but whose activities may impact upon the combatant command or task force, should report allegations through the Army chain of command to the DAIG, with an information copy to the combatant command/task force J2. This ensures all affected elements are aware of the allegations, and can identify and correct systemic issues that may surface as a result of the inquiry.

SUPPORTING POINTS:

- DODD 2310.1 provides that the SA, as the DoD EA for the administration of the DoD EPOW Detainee Program, shall act on behalf of the Department of Defense to develop and provide policy and planning guidance to the combatant commander for the treatment, care, accountability, legal status, and administrative procedures for all personnel captured or detained by, or transferred from the care, custody, and control of, the U.S. Military Services.
- General Order # 09-03: provides that, effective 26 September 2003, the Provost Marshal General (PMG) will exercise Secretary of the Army's Executive Agent responsibilities for Detainee Operations. The PMG is the proponent for AR 190-8, the Multi-Service Regulation that provides policy for detainee operations and promulgates Geneva Conventions and DODD 2310.1.
- AR 381-10 applies to all Army personnel conducting intelligence activities.

Abu Ghraib fight leaves 2 detainees dead, 5 wounded

BAGHDAD - A fight that broke out among detainees at the Abu Ghraib detention facility early this morning resulted in the death of two detainees, with five others wounded...

The altercation among the detainees broke out at about 5:45 a.m., when guards observed a large group of security detainees attacking another detainee using rocks and tent poles. Guards attempted to intervene with verbal warnings, but the situation continued to escalate and the number of detainees involved swelled to over 200, resulting in the use of non-lethal rounds to disperse the group. When this failed to quell the situation and it was determined that a detainee's life was still at risk, lethal force was authorized, and the situation was brought under control.

Medical assistance was immediately provided on site and at the detention hospital. The circumstances surrounding the incident remain under investigation.




Staff Process Chart







GENERAL SITUATION

Following 9/11 –

Few Soldiers with any significant experience in detainee and detainee-interrogation operations.

Army doctrine and training focused on a linear battlefield that did not envision significant numbers of detainees.

That changed beginning with operations in Afghanistan and continues in Iraq.

- Since October 2001, U.S. forces have detained in excess of 50,000 individuals including enemy prisoners of war and several categories of civilian internees.
- Detainee operations have been conducted in support of ongoing military operations against enemies who do not follow the Geneva conventions and who violate the Law of War.
- New operational environment demands significant levels of human intelligence.

Soldiers and leaders adapted and continue to adapt tactics, techniques and procedures (TTP) to accomplish their mission in this new environment.

In support, the Army began evaluating detainee operations through on-site assessments and incoming theater requirements to determine relevant P – DOTLMLPF implications and to develop appropriate solutions.

Detainee abuse cases have over-shadowed the actions of the hundreds of thousands of Soldiers who have served and continue to serve with distinction and honor.

Detainee abuse cases have also served to decrease the visibility of ongoing Army actions to improve detention and interrogation capabilities.

Ultimately, must recognize that the actions of a single Soldier may have strategic and operational implications:

- *the impact of detainee abuse on the successful outcome of specific OEF and OIF objectives may not be known for some time*
- *already readily apparent that the cases of detainee abuse have weakened the U.S. military's example of moral leadership not only in Arabic countries, but around the world, and even in the United States where the American people are questioning the values of their Army*

- **Place new demands on Soldiers closest to the “emotion” of the action to quickly gain actionable intelligence from detainees at a location near the point of their detention.**
- **Require the Army to continually prepare Soldiers to understand that the inhumane treatment of detainees is prohibited and can never be justified, even by the stress of combat or deep provocation.**

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



- Two detainees (Habibullah, Dilawar) died at Bagram, 4 and 10 Dec 02.
- Both detainees suffered blunt force trauma; the autopsies classified both deaths as homicides in Mar 03.
- Established Task Force at CID HQ in Aug 03.
- Active duty MI and USAR MP Soldiers titled for Involuntary Manslaughter, Negligent Homicide, Maiming, Assault and Battery, Indecent Acts or Liberties with Another, Maltreatment of a Person in US Custody, False Official Statement, Dereliction of Duty, Failure to Obey a Lawful Order and Conspiracy.
 - MP CPT titled for Negligent Homicide, False Official Statement, Dereliction of Duty, Failure to Obey a Lawful Order and Conspiracy.
 - MI CPT titled for Maltreatment of a Person in US Custody, False Official Statement and Conspiracy.
- Total of 43 subjects (Habibullah Case = 4 MI / 11 MP / 1 Civ; Dilawar Case = 7 MI / 19 MP / 1 Civ. Same Subjects ID in both cases = 3 MI / 10 MP).

DETAINEE ABUSE AT ABU GHRAIB PRISON (372d MP Co (USAR) / 325th MI Bn)

Background:

- MP soldier notified CID of detainee abuse and provided a CD.
- Abuse occurred during night shift Oct – Dec 03.
- To date, investigation has identified 12 enlisted (9 MP and 3 MI) and one civilian (Titan contractor) as subjects and 29 victims. Most senior person titled is Army SSG.
- Offenses are: Assault and Battery, Indecent Acts, Indecent Assault, Dereliction of Duty, Failure to Obey a Lawful Order, Cruelty and Maltreatment, False Official Statement, Reckless Endangerment, Impeding a Legal Process, Obstruction of Justice and Conspiracy.

Status:

- Charges preferred against six Soldier subjects
- DOJ pursuing charges against civilian subject
- Case remains open to identify additional possible subjects and victims and to collect and examine evidence



CID Detainee Summary

BRIDGE INCIDENT – SAMARRA, IRAQ (A Co, 1/8th Inf, 4th ID)

Background:

- Two Iraqis detained for curfew violations. Both forced from a bridge by Soldiers.
- One detainee apparently drowned. Body not found for 12 days, and because of security considerations was never examined.
- CID investigation initiated as a result of family posting incident on personal website.
- Soldiers and officers conspired to cover up the incident.

Status:

- Investigation is closed. Investigation identified ten Soldiers as involved in the conspiracy and death. Six of the ten soldiers received non-judicial punishment and four remaining soldiers are pending court-martial at Ft Carson, CO.
- Offenses are: Involuntary Manslaughter, Aggravated Assault, False Official Statement, Conspiracy, Accessory After the Fact, Obstruction of Justice.
- Body exhumation may be reconsidered.

MAJOR GENERAL MOWHOUSH DEATH INVESTIGATION (66TH MI Co / 3^D ACR / 5th SFG / OGA)

Background:

- Former Iraqi MG died on 26 Nov 03 at 3d ACR facility (FOB Tiger). Examination of body revealed evidence of blunt force trauma.
- Autopsy listed cause of death as asphyxia due to smothering and chest compression – manner of death homicide.
- Detainee died while undergoing “stress technique” interrogation by MI Soldiers. Three MI and one ACR Soldiers confessed.
- Investigation also indicated MI, SF and OGA interviews of detainee on 24 Nov 03 involved physical assaults. Investigation confirmed those assaults.
- At present, there are ten identified subjects (3 MI, 3 SF, 3 OGA, and 1 assigned to another 3^d ACR unit).
- Offenses are: Involuntary Manslaughter, Negligent Homicide, Aggravated Assault, False Official Statement and Dereliction of Duty.

Status:

- Investigation on-going in conjunction with OGA and DOJ.
- Interim report to action commanders pending classification vetting by OGA.
