INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

On 26 Jul 04, this investigation was initiated based upon the receipt of a Memorandum of Transmittal (MOT) 0121-04-CID789, from the Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq (IZ), detailing an alleged abuse involving Mr. <sup>b7c-4, b6-4</sup> [REDACTED], by U.S. Coalition Forces when he was apprehended. Mr. <sup>b7c-4, b6-4</sup> [REDACTED] alleged during his apprehension, U.S. Coalition Forces kicked him in the chest, stomach, and back multiple times, punched him in the face, and a soldier stood on his knees while he was lying on the ground.

Investigation established sufficient evidence to prove the offenses of Aggravated Assault, Cruelty and Maltreatment and Conspiracy did not occur as alleged. Investigation clearly demonstrated the detainee resisted apprehension and needed two to be subdued by members of the apprehending unit. The details of the apprehension were documented within hours of the incident. Throughout the investigation, numerous members of the unit, to include the unit commander, and the unit

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medics provided sworn statements hours after the apprehension and again months after the incident and all reported the same chain of events. All witnesses detailed the detainee "lunged" at one of the apprehending unit members and was subsequently restrained. There was no evidence of any injury noted during his medical screening immediately following his apprehension. This provided sufficient contradictory evidence to prove the assault/cruelty did not occur as alleged.

THIS INVESTIGATION WAS INITIATED UPON RECEIPT OF A MEMORANDUM OF TRANSMITTAL (MOT) 0121-04-CID789, FROM THE BAGHDAD CENTRAL CONFINEMENT FACILITY (BCCF), ABU GHRAIB, IRAQ (IZ), DETAILING ALLEGED ABUSE INVOLVING MR [REDACTED] BY U.S. COALITION FORCES WHEN HE WAS APPREHENDED.

INVESTIGATION DETERMINED THERE WAS INSUFFICIENT EVIDENCE TO PROVE OR DISPROVE THAT ALLEGATIONS OF ABUSE OCCURRED AS ORIGINALLY REPORTED BY MR [REDACTED]. MR [REDACTED] ALLEGED DURING HIS APPREHENSION U.S. COALITION FORCES KICKED HIM IN THE CHEST, STOMACH, AND BACK MULTIPLE TIMES, PUNCHED HIM IN THE FACE, AND A SOLDIER STOOD ON HIS KNEES WHILE HE WAS LYING ON THE GROUND. HE ALSO ALLEGED DURING HIS APPREHENSION AN ARABIC SPEAKING INTERPRETER THREATENED HIM WITH BEING EXECUTED. INTERVIEWS OF SOLDIERS WHO TOOK PART IN MR [REDACTED] APPREHENSION REVEALED MR [REDACTED] LUNGED AT A SOLDIER DURING THE APPREHENSION AND WAS RESTRAINED. SOLDIERS, AND THE IRAQI INTERPRETER WHO WERE PRESENT DURING MR [REDACTED] APPREHENSION, WERE INTERVIEWED AND DENIED THAT MR [REDACTED] WAS ABUSED DURING HIS APPREHENSION. THIS INVESTIGATION DID NOT FURTHER DIMINISH THE INTEGRITY OR CREDIBILITY OF MR [REDACTED] ALLEGATIONS.

INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

This investigation was initiated upon receipt of a Memorandum of Transmittal (MOT) 0121-04-  
 CID789, from the Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq (IZ),  
 detailing alleged abuse involving Mr <sup>b7c-4, b6-4</sup> [REDACTED] by U.S. Coalition Forces when he was  
 apprehended.

Investigation determined there was insufficient evidence to prove or disprove that allegations of  
 abuse occurred as originally reported by Mr <sup>b7c-4, b6-4</sup> [REDACTED] Mr <sup>b7c-4, b6-4</sup> [REDACTED] alleged during his apprehension  
 U.S. Coalition Forces kicked him in the chest, stomach, and back multiple times, punched him in  
 the face, and a soldier stood on his knees while he was lying on the ground. He also alleged  
 during his apprehension an Arabic speaking interpreter threatened him with being executed. <sup>b7c-4, b6-4</sup>  
 Interviews of soldiers who took part in Mr <sup>b7c-4, b6-4</sup> [REDACTED] apprehension revealed Mr <sup>b7c-4, b6-4</sup> [REDACTED] lunged at  
 a soldier during the apprehension and was restrained. Soldiers, and the Iraqi interpreter who  
 were present during Mr <sup>b7c-4, b6-4</sup> [REDACTED] apprehension, were interviewed and denied that Mr <sup>b7c-4, b6-4</sup> [REDACTED]  
 was abused during his apprehension. This investigation did not further diminish the integrity or  
 credibility of Mr <sup>b7c-4, b6-4</sup> [REDACTED] allegations.

## DETAILS

**BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION:** On 26 Jul 04 the 504th Military Intelligence (MI) Brigade (BDE), Joint Interrogation and Debriefing Center (JIDC), Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq, (AGI), reported that Detainee [REDACTED], Interment Serial Number (ISN) [REDACTED], alleged he had been abused while being detained by Coalition Forces (CF) at an unknown location, prior to his arrival at BCCF, AGI. *b7c-4, b6-4*

About 0900, 26 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] received a written statement from SPC [REDACTED] A Company, 202nd MI Battalion (Bn), JIDC, BCCF, AGI. The statement detailed Detainee [REDACTED] allegations of abuse at the hands of US soldiers at the time of his initial capture. *b7c-1, b6-1*

About 0910, 26 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] queried the Biometrics Automated Toolset (BATS) system and determined Detainee [REDACTED] had been interrogated four times since arriving at the BCCF. SPC [REDACTED] was present for all four interrogations of Detainee [REDACTED] (See Interrogation Records and Reports.) *b7c-4, b6-4*

Agent's Notes: No other interrogators will be interviewed because SPC [REDACTED] was present for all four interrogations. *b7c-4, b6-4*

About 0945, 26 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] obtained and reviewed Detainee [REDACTED] detainee file. The detainee file contained a statement written by the detaining soldiers who stated that Detainee [REDACTED] resisted arrest and attacked a soldier. Also in the detainee file was a copy of Detainee [REDACTED] initial medical screening at the BCCF In-Processing Facility, dated 11 May 04. The medical screening form noted possible detainee abuse. (See In-Processing Medical Screening form.) *b7c-1, b6-1*

About 0830, 29 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] and Interpreter [REDACTED] Titan Corporation, Baghdad International Airport (BIAP), Baghdad, IZ, interviewed Detainee [REDACTED] at the BCCF In-processing Facility. Prior to conducting the interview, SA [REDACTED] verified Detainee [REDACTED] identity by comparing the individual to his photograph and examining his detainee ID bracelet. Detainee [REDACTED] stated during the late night of 04 May 04 or the very early morning of 05 May 04, US soldiers entering his home awakened him. Also in the house at the time were his two brothers and his son. When the soldiers entered his bedroom, they were yelling at him in English and all he understood of what they said was his name. When he acknowledged his name, the soldiers forced him to the floor and handcuffed him behind his back with plastic handcuffs. After doing this, one of the soldiers, Detainee [REDACTED] could not tell which, began to yell at him. The only word he could understand was "RPG-7." As the soldier was yelling at him, one or more of the soldiers was kicking him in the chest, stomach, and back. Detainee [REDACTED] stated he could not identify who was kicking him because he closed his eyes. After a short while, the soldiers lifted him up and sat him on a small table in the bedroom. One of the soldiers, thru an Arabic language interpreter, continued to demand to know where his weapons cache was concealed. Detainee [REDACTED] told the soldiers that he did not know. *b7c-1, b6-1*

about any weapons cache. A soldier then punched Detainee [REDACTED] in the face knocking him backward. At this point, the interpreter told him they were going to take him to a school in the area and locate his weapons cache. The interpreter told him that if they found the weapons cache, they were going to execute him on the spot. Detainee [REDACTED] stated the soldiers then lead him outside to waiting military vehicle. While doing this, an unknown soldier squeezed his arms very tightly and rammed him into the side of the vehicle before placing him inside. The soldiers then drove him to the school in his residence. Detainee [REDACTED] said the soldiers walked him thru the school, starting in the basement, and repeatedly demanded that he show them where his weapons were hidden. According to Detainee [REDACTED], he repeatedly told the soldiers thru the interpreter that he did not know anything about any weapons hidden in the school. When they reached the roof of the school, the soldiers forced Detainee [REDACTED] to sit in a chair on the roof. One soldier repeatedly demanded, again thru the interpreter, that he tell them where he was hiding the weapons cache. Detainee [REDACTED] stated he told them he did not know anything about a weapons cache. At this time, one of the soldiers tipped the chair over Detainee [REDACTED] said he fell out of chair and onto his back. The soldier who had been doing most of the talking then stepped onto Detainee [REDACTED] legs and stood on his knees. The soldier ground the soles of his boots into Detainee [REDACTED] knees while he continued to demand information about the weapons cache. After a few minutes, the soldiers walked Detainee [REDACTED] downstairs and loaded him into a military vehicle. They transported him an unknown temporary holding facility and then subsequently onto the BCCF. Detainee [REDACTED] said he believed he was initially kicked 15 or 16 times while in his bedroom. He could not describe the soldiers who kicked him. Detainee [REDACTED] described the soldier who stood on his knees as a male, white, 35 to 40 years of age, ruddy complexion, 5'07" to 5'09", medium build, unknown hair and eye color, no facial or visible tattoos; he was wearing standard Army pattern desert camouflage uniform (DCU), Kevlar helmet, and battle equipment. He was only carrying a handgun. The only marking on the uniform he saw a US flag patch. Detainee [REDACTED] stated he was unsure if he could identify the soldier if seen again. Detainee [REDACTED] described the interpreter as a male, unknown race and age, 6'0", medium build, wearing DCU's, a Kevlar helmet and body armor. Detainee [REDACTED] stated the interpreter spoke Arabic with an Iraqi accent. He also stated he did not hear anyone called by name during the incident.

Detainee [REDACTED] stated he has not experienced any other incidents of abuse since being taken into Coalition custody.

Detainee [REDACTED] stated that when he was initially in-processed at BCCF someone took photographs of the bruising to the right bicep. He also stated that when he was medically screened during in processing, he complained of being abused at the time of his arrest. (See Medical Screening Record.)

Detainee [REDACTED] complained of knee pain during his interview and stated that an Iraqi doctor who was interned with him examined his knees and told him that he would need surgery to correct the injury he had received. About 0930, 26 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] took Detainee [REDACTED] to the BCCF In-

About 1000, 30 Aug 04, SA [redacted] interviewed SSG [redacted], B Company, 8<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion, Camp Ferrin-Huggins, Baghdad, IZ, APO AE 09310 (CFH), who related the mission started about 0100 to 0130, 5 Aug 04. SSG [redacted] related his squad's mission was to search the schoolyard for weapons caches. SSG [redacted] stated he observed the detainee for about a minute at the schoolyard sitting in a chair. SSG [redacted] stated there was no power at the schoolyard only flashlights illuminated the area. SSG [redacted] stated he observed a number of senior officer personnel around the detainee, most notably LTC [redacted] who was the Battalion Commander for 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, 8<sup>th</sup> Calvary Regiment (1/8<sup>th</sup> CAV REGT), FFH. SSG [redacted] explained he also observed CPT [redacted] 1/8<sup>th</sup> CAV REGT, FFH (NFI). SSG [redacted] related he turned the detainee into the Battalion Internment Facility (BIF) and completed the appropriate paperwork. SSG [redacted] stated at no time did he see anyone strike or abuse the detainee. SSG [redacted] related he did not observe any visible injuries on the detainee's face.

Agent's Note: SSG [redacted] could not recall if the prisoner was blind-folded or had a bag over his head when he was in processing at the BIF.

Mr [REDACTED] related during the raid soldiers were looking for a weapons cache at Mr [REDACTED] residence in the [REDACTED] district of Baghdad, and at a children's memorial near Mr [REDACTED] residence. Mr [REDACTED] stated when the soldiers entered Mr [REDACTED] residence they detained him and found three fake ID's cards all with Mr [REDACTED] picture, and three different names on them. Mr [REDACTED] stated he assisted in questioning Mr [REDACTED] at the residence and was told to ask Mr [REDACTED] about a weapons cache the soldiers were looking for. He related every time he asked Mr [REDACTED] a question he would deny any knowledge of a weapons cache. Mr [REDACTED] stated after they left Mr [REDACTED] house they took Mr [REDACTED] to the children's memorial near by, where other soldiers from 1/8th CAV were also searching for a weapons cache. He related the soldiers who searched the memorial found a RPG sight, but he could not remember if they found anything else. Mr. [redacted] related every time he asked Mr. [redacted] where the weapons cache was and about the graffiti on the wall Mr. [redacted] denied any knowledge of both the cache and the meaning of the graffiti and that he had never been to the children's memorial before. Mr. [redacted] related the soldiers asked another Iraqi, who was near the memorial to look at Mr. [redacted] to see if he had ever seen Mr. [redacted] at memorial, and the individual said he had seen him at the memorial before. Mr. [redacted] stated when they left the memorial soldiers picked Mr. [redacted] up out of the chair, and Mr. [redacted] pants fell down and he fell over. He related soldiers caught Mr. [redacted] before he hit the ground, and they pulled his pants back up. Then they put Mr. [redacted] in a vehicle and took him back to Camp Ferrin-Huggins. Mr. [redacted] stated when they put Mr. [redacted] in the vehicle that was the last time he saw him. I, [REDACTED], WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

Near the beginning of May, like the 4th of May, we hit a target that night around midnight. I had my platoon hit two objectives. One was the target's house, the other was a school adjacent to a children's memorial. The task + purpose of hitting the house was to detain a cell leader; the task + purpose of hitting the school was to locate a weapons cache on its grounds.

At midnight about 18 of my soldiers cordon + searched the target's house. I was in charge of this element and on the ground. In addition to my platoon, there were about 4 MILIT's with leadership from 1-8 CAV observing our actions. We entered the house with about 10-9 soldiers from my platoon. We immediately secured the house by segregating males in one room and children and females in another. The target was the only male in the house. So upon securing the house we began "clearing" the house. This consists of searching every room for contraband. During the "clearing" phase I was not in the room with the target. I was managing my two squad leaders in clearing the house. During the "clearing" phase, the target was being tactically questioned by [REDACTED] of B/1-8 CAV and HHC/1-8 Cav. None of my soldiers were present. However, I was told that during tactical questioning the target tried to "rush" SFC [REDACTED] of HHC/1-8 CAV. They subdued the target and moved him to a vehicle outside. The target was in the room for about 10 minutes. The [REDACTED] from time on target to when we left took about 15 minutes. Once we left the objective "A", we went to objective "B" which

[REDACTED] was the schoolyard. We sat at the schoolyard for about 30 minutes trying to gather up IAG's and get accountability straight. During the time [REDACTED] while at the school, HHC/1-8 Cav took the detainee out of my vehicle into the children's memorial to finish tactical questioning. I did not see him the entire time. We left objective B and went to the Daura Power Plant to drop off our interpreter, then proceeded to the FOB and the BIF.

To clear up any misconceptions, my soldiers woke up the target, walked him to the empty room, zip-tied him, and secured him until elements from HHC/1-8 CAV started tactical questioning. Then all elements from my platoon were focused on searching the house. We did not abuse the prisoner in any way, shape or form.

In the beginning of May 2004 I received intelligence on an AIF cell leader that was conducting attacks and storing weapons in the Al Dara area of Baghdad. This cell leader was said to be storing weapons in a Childrens Memorial which was a couple of blocks east of his house in Neighborhood B22. At the time of the raid I was Commander of B/1-8 CAV, and assigned my attached engineer platoon 1/B/BEN to execute the raid. Half of the element was to assault the suspects residence, and the other half was to search the Childrens Memorial for weapons caches. Time on target was sometime around midnight, and we hit both targets at the same time. I accompanied the element that was going to the suspects residence. We arrived at the residence with approximately 7-8 vehicles, which included 3rd vehicle that held the platoon from B/B EN, the Battalion commander's (LTC [REDACTED]) personal security team, and my truck. The assault team knocked on the door and entered without resistance. I immediately followed the assault team into the house, once they said it was clear. When I entered the house, LT [REDACTED], the B/B EN platoon leader had already separated the women and children from the men, in accordance with standard operating procedures. In the house I observed 1 man in one room, and a women and child in another room. SGT [REDACTED] my gunner, accompanied me into the house when I first went in, and LTC [REDACTED] along with 2-3 personnel from his personal security team followed me in. Once in the house, I observed that the suspect was on the ground, and I started asking him questions which included, what was his name, what did he do. Standard initial questions. As I was talking to him I found 3 identification cards in a drawer that all had his face on them, but with different names. I started asking him where did he get them and what did he use them for. After about 2 minutes of questioning I got a call on the radio from LT [REDACTED] that he had found a passage into an adjacent house, and that he was sending in a few soldiers to search. When I heard a banging noise inside, that sounded like somebody knocked over a table. When I had gone outside I left LTC [REDACTED], SFC [REDACTED], ISG [REDACTED], and SGT [REDACTED] inside the house. I went back inside and [REDACTED] and another person, I don't remember who, were holding the suspect up against a corner, and LTC [REDACTED] had told me that the suspect had gone after SFC [REDACTED] and ISG [REDACTED]. I instructed them to zip tie the suspect and secure him in the truck. The suspect was on the chair for more than 5 minutes, when I recommended to LTC [REDACTED] that we needed to get off of the objective, and that I didn't feel that the suspect was going to give us anything useful. At that point SFC [REDACTED] lifted the suspect off the chair and walked him back to the truck. ## DETAILS

**BASIS FOR RE-INVESTIGATION:** About 1530, 14 Feb 05, this office and 11<sup>th</sup> MP Battalion (CID) Operations Officer, Camp Victory, Iraq conducted a review of this investigation to ensure the administrative and investigative requirements were met within the provisions of CID Regulation 195-1 and CID Operational Directives. It was decided to reopen this investigation, conduct a thorough review of this investigation and determine if the investigative summary supported the listed offense and justified the listing of those offenses as "insufficient evidence".

**SUMMARY OF SIGNIFIGANT EVENTS:** About 0900, 15 Feb 05, the undersigned conducted a thorough review of this investigation and determined the investigation clearly demonstrates the detainee was not injured during his apprehension or subsequent interrogations by the Coalition Forces. This fact was documented within hours of the apprehension and during subsequent interviews of apprehending soldiers and a medical screening conducted after his apprehension. The review indicates the investigation does not support listing the offenses as "Insufficient Evidence" rather, clearly indicates the offense did not occur as alleged and should therefore list the offenses as "Unfounded". A review of the Report of Investigation completed on 9 Nov Oct 04 (original maintained in the files of the USACRC), revealed the following documentation/testimony to supporting this conclusion.

- Exhibit 4 through 9: Statements from the Apprehending Unit Members, clearly documents the detainee was apprehended, resisted apprehension and had to be subdued by two members of the unit. The statements indicate, during the apprehension, the detainee "lunged" at one of the soldiers and was subsequently subdued with the appropriate force required.
- Exhibits 4 and 5: Medical Screening Documents, completed on 5 May 04, indicate there were no indication of injuries and determined there were no signs of injuries consistent with the detainee's claim of assault.

This provides sufficient contradictory evidence to prove the assault/cruelty did not occur as alleged.



REVIEW OF ROI 0259-04-CID259-80291 (ASSAULT; CRUELTY & MALTREATMENT - IRAQ)

**Findings:**

1. The INV SUM does not support the listed offenses, nor justify the listing of those offenses as "insufficient evidence". A review of the investigation clearly demonstrates the detainee was not injured when he was captured and interviewed by Coalition Forces on 5 May 2004.

- Exhibits 4 through 9: Statements of members of the capturing team and medical records of the victim clearly documents the detainee was captured, resisted the apprehension and was subdued by two members of the coalition force. The attending members and the interpreter (who subsequently made sworn statements – Exhibits 6, 10, 11, 14, 15, and 16). During the course of the detainment, the victim "lunged at one of the coalition forces and was subdued.
- Additionally, Exhibit 4 and 5 contains information from a medical professional who examined the detainee ( 5 May 04) for evidence of injury and found nothing consistent with the injuries the detainee reported.

This provides sufficient contradictory evidence to prove the assault/cruelty did not occur as alleged. The incident of the detainee was immediately reported by the capturing forces.

2. The case (once unfounded) does not require a FINAL C. It is simply a FINAL and there is no requirement to list "Leads Remaining"

**Recommendation:** Complete a 1<sup>st</sup> Supplemental reflecting the reopening of the investigation, unfound the offenses reported and document the review of the relevant facts in a supplementary AIR, which will be an added exhibit in the FSU closing this case.
